

The Christmas Star of 2020

We had our own Christmas Star this year. During December there was a rare conjunction of the planets Jupiter and Saturn in the western sky visible after sunset. The two planets, although more than 400 million miles apart, were within less than one degree in the line of sight from earth. On December 21, the winter solstice, they appeared to be almost touching.

Conjunctions of these planets occur about every 20 years, but the last time they were this close was over 800 years ago on March 5, 1226, the year St. Francis of Assisi died. If you missed this rare event, replays of the close alignment are available on YouTube.

It was a similar conjunction during the Christmas season of 1604 that led astronomer Johannes Kepler to wonder if the gospel star (Mt 2:1-12) was not a typical star but a rare conjunction of planets. Kepler then calculated the astronomical data and found a rare conjunction in 4 BC, which has led many astronomers to accept such a conjunction as the star that led the magi.

The Star of Bethlehem as a conjunction of planets and not the brilliant light of Christmas cards may disappoint you. There have been other

scientific proposals for the star — a comet, etc., but none are

historically verifiable nor do they behave as similar to the star in Matthew's gospel as a conjunction does. Planets have retrograde motion, appear on the horizon, seem to disappear and then reappear on the other horizon.

There is a faith message here. Whatever the unusual celestial event at the birth of Christ, it was noticed only few professional by astronomers. The magi were led to Christ not by a miraculous vision but by the tedious work of their profession. Today's feast of the Epiphany means manifestation. God manifests himself in many ways. God revealed Himself to the magi by their study of astronomy. It was their daily work that led them to Christ. Sadlv. the stress competition of our work can lead us away from God.

It is obvious that we might find God in church and at prayer. The magi remind us that we should also find Him in our daily work. The tools and talents of the craftsman, the pots and pans of the cook, the paper and pencil of the student can lead one to God. The magi were astronomers and God called them to himself through their calculations of the stars. The wise still follow his star.

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.

Repair Work at St. Fidelis

You may have noticed some scaffolding all around the inside of the Basilica of St. Fidelis. Repair work to fix falling plaster and a repainting of the entire inside has begun. It has been 25 years since the last major repainting and repair work; however, minor repair and painting jobs have occurred during those 25 years.

Tim Linenberger, with Linenberger Painting and Contracting of Salina, Kansas, and his crew are in charge of the project which is expected to take approximately three months. Tim is a member of the family that has painted St. Fidelis several times—in 1943, 1961, 1979, and 1996.

The redecorating is being done using the same colors as are currently on the walls. Masses will continue as usual.
