

### The Bindweed

Having heard this Sunday's gospel parable of the mustard seed, an old farmer said, "Ain't never seen no mustard seeds, but I have seen many bindweeds and they grow from tiny seeds to be every bit as tall and hardy as those mustard plants in the good book."

Most of us have never seen a

mustard seed. The closest most Americans get to mustard is on a hot dog. Yet we instinctively find today's parable of the mustard seed compelling. We appreciate the marvel that great things come from small beginnings. An old proverb resonates with today's gospel, "Mighty oaks from tiny acorns grow."

As all gospel parables, that of the mustard seed is open to various reflections. The early fathers of the Church saw the parables as allegories with each feature of a parable representing a different aspect of faith. The mustard seed and large plant were images of our Christian life.

For example, the parable says that the grown mustard seed put forth large branches so that the birds of the sky came and made nests in its shade. There are three images here: birds, nests, and shade. Some saw the birds as the gentiles in the shade of Israel, God's chosen people. For others the birds were sinners and outcasts finding refuge in the mercy of Christ. Still others understood the birds negatively, as heretics hiding in the dark corners of the church.

The *nests* built in the branches of the mustard plant imply finding a home. Believers find a home in their faith community here on earth and the promise of a lasting home in heaven. This has a wider interpretation beyond faithful Christians. Jews and Gentiles, sinners and schismatics, even pagans and atheists are all invited to find a home in the kingdom of God.

The shade of the branches indicates comfort and refuge. Christians Most have experienced that their faith is not only a challenge living a better life, but that it provides comfort and refuge in time of trials. The parable of the mustard seed is a reassurance to

Christians who live in a

world that is often hostile to their faith that they are sheltered in the providence of God.

The tiny mustard seed is a promise of great things. Although those bindweeds are a nuisance to farmers, yet their persistence and survival in drought and heat is a symbol of the endurance of our faith through the trials and burdens of life. And we have inherited such faith from our ancestors whose commitment was as enduring as those annoying bindweeds.
