Selfish Charity?

The nihilist philosopher Frederich Neitzche criticized Christian charity as selfishness. He maintained that the acts of kindness proposed by Christ in the gospel are simply a way for Christians to feel superior to others while making the needy dependent on Although them. criticism misrepresents Christian charity, he does remind us of a hidden danger if we help others just to feel good and noble. Charity can be tainted with selfishness.

The gospel on this feast of Christ the King is about the last judgment where the standard of judgment is helping the needy. Those who gave food to the hungry and drink to the thirsty inherited eternal life; those who

did not were condemned to eternal punishment. Since nothing is explicit in this gospel about faith one might wrongly conclude that their motives were irrelevant.

Another philosopher, Aristotle, said that wisdom is "attention to the whole." The whole of a kind act includes the motive. Christian charity must have a Christian motive. Purely secular philanthropy is not envisioned in the good works counseled by the gospel. It must be a charity that is done out of love of God.

The righteous were rewarded not simply for being kind to the needy. Christ said that they were kind to Him. "I was hungry. I was thirsty. I was a stranger. What you did for the least of mine, you did for me." Not for yourself and your comfort. All of us have mixed

and imperfect motives for our works of charity, but love of God must be the determining factor. As the late Mother Theresa said of her nuns, "We are not social workers. We touch the body of Christ."

This proper motive is so essential that St. Augustine would counsel, 2 "Love God, and then do whatever you want to do." He meant that if we truly love God, we will do only what is good and with an unselfish motive.

This is not a denial of the goodness in those who are not Christian. The redemption of Christ is universal and unless it is explicitly rejected by those not baptized, their charity shares in the mission of the gospel. Their charity

> may also be rewarded through an implicit faith.

On the day οf judgement envisioned in today's Gospel, Christ the

King will call those to eternal life who have loved him by doing acts of kindness to the less fortunate. They were moved to do so, not to feel superior or noble, but because they saw the same image of God in the needy as in themselves.

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. It is likely this dispensation will stay in place through 2020. The dispensation from Sunday Mass continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions. However, Catholics are still obliged to the Commandments, including keep Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, especially during the Christmas Season, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.





Pregnant women and struggling families with young children require assistance with their material and spiritual needs, regardless of their background. For low-income Hispanic women, this is especially true, because linguistic and cultural differences pose unique challenges for pregnancy volunteers and pastoral ministers.

In the Dioceses of Yakima and Spokane in central and eastern Washington, for example, your generosity to the Catholic Campaign for Human Development helps a group called PREPARES en español to minister to large and vibrant Hispanic communities. 
