Faith of Our Fathers

The four gospels use the word father a total of 234 times: 15 in Mark, 42 in Luke, 69 in Matthew and in John's gospel a remarkable 108 times. These numbers alone are testimony to

the importance of fatherhood in our Christian faith.

In the scriptural genealogies father indicates the parent of a human family. In the Lord's Prayer designates the heavenly Father of us all. In his parables Christ used the image of a father to teach the kingdom of God. The most frequent meaning of the word father on the

lips of Christ is his heavenly Father, with whom he shares divinity.

In the sacraments we are frequently reminded of the importance of fathers. In baptism the blessing for the father of the child says, "God is the father of all life, human and divine." The fatherhood of God is revealed in his creative power and providential care of his creatures. Parental fathers share in these by giving life and loving care to their children.

The sacrament of penance is the church's greatest expression of God's mercy. When Christ wanted to teach us about the mercy of his Father he used the example of a father in the parable of the Prodigal Son. That story, although usually referred to as the parable of the Prodigal Son, is also known as the parable of the Forgiving Father. In the Lord's Prayer we ask *Our Father who art in heaven* to "Forgive

us our trespasses.

We also ask Him, "Give us this day our daily bread." The father of a family provides daily bread for his children. He rightly delights in presiding at the

family table. At the Eucharistic table our heavenly Father provides his earthly pilgrims with the bread of heaven.

Some are troubled by the verse in Matthew's gospel, "Call no one on earth your father." Our

Father's Day helps to put that verse in context. We honor our fathers today in the spirit the fourth

celebration of

commandment, "Honor your father and your mother." We are not replacing the unique fatherhood of our heavenly Father, but recognizing that parental fathers are to do His work on earth and to model their service on the goodness of their heavenly Father.

We celebrate Fathers Day to honor our fathers for their faithful service and to remind them that their vocation as a father is to be modeled on "Our Father who art in heaven."


