## **Christopher Columbus Revisited**

"In fourteen-ninety-two Columbus sailed the ocean blue." Seniors will remember when that little ditty was a fun part of history class. Things have changed. Monday, Columbus Day, will



A mob recently tore down the statue of Christopher Columbus in the Ohio city named for him. A little background may be helpful to sort out conflicting ideas.

The Spanish Crown and Columbus hoped to discover a new way to a new land for new riches. But another objective was to bring Christianity to that new land. Consider the names of the ships: the Nina, the Pinta and the Sancta Maria. The full name of the flagship was La Santa María de la Inmaculada Concepción, the Blessed Mary of the Immaculate Conception. Columbus named the first island on which he set foot, San Salvador, the Holy Savior. Another island he named Sancta Maria de la Concepcion, the archipelago near Cuba, "Our Lady's Sea" and the island there, Sancta Maria Rotunda.

However, his efforts in dealing with the native people were often misguided and his crew took advantage of innocent people for which some modern historians tend to

judge them rather harshly. Yet the history of our own nation, as most nations, betrays similar faults. For example, the land that Columbus discovered was soon afflicted with a religious intolerance fueled by organizations such as the Klu Klux Klan, the Nativist movement, and the Know-Nothing Party.

In 1881 a parish priest in New Haven, Connecticut, Fr. Michael McGivney, organized a group of men to provide financial and moral support for immigrants, especially widows and orphans, subjected to this religious discrimination. He named his fraternal benevolent society *The Knights of Columbus*, after Christopher Columbus to recall that this land was discovered by a man of their faith, despite his failings.

As attitudes became more tolerant Fr. McGivney's group of Catholic men adapted to the evolving social needs of immigrants and their descendants. Today the Knights of Columbus, whose charitable works are well known, are a thriving fraternal organization nearly two million strong. Along with other such benevolent groups sponsored by various faiths they enrich the social fabric of our nation.

Each new generation has the right and the responsibility to review and evaluate the history they inherit, which is seldom perfect. We must balance the failings of famous historical persons with their contributions to our welfare. In making such a judgement an old adage cautions us not to "throw out the baby with the dirty bath water." And the gospel challenges us, "Let the one who is without sin cast the first stone."
