Baptism Revisited



Today's feast of the *Baptism of the Lord* raises this question: "Why was the sinless Jesus baptized?" A good question. It makes us reflect on how our baptism relates us to Christ. The baptism of Jesus and our baptism are the same, yet different.

At the baptism of Jesus the voice of God the Father said, "This is my beloved Son." At your baptism you were confirmed as a child of God. Baptism purifies from sin and makes one an adopted child of God, a co-heir with Christ. But there is a big difference. By baptism you were made a daughter or a son of God, but not **the** Son of God. Christ is a divine person. You are a human person who can, by grace, share in the divine life of Christ, but that grace does not originate from you.

Another dimension of the Baptism of Jesus and our baptism is the Paschal Mystery, which we share in different ways. The baptism of Jesus was his acceptance of his mission as God's Suffering Servant. He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." The baptism of Christ by John anticipated his death on the cross, which he spoke of in the gospels as the *baptism* he must endure.

By our baptism we share in this Paschal Mystery as the saved, not the

Savior. Through Baptism the Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipated his death and resurrection. The Christian must enter into this mystery by repentance, going down into the water with Jesus in order to rise with him to live a new life of grace. In brief, becoming a child of God at baptism has responsibilities as well as benefits. For the parents as well as the child.

This blessing for the parents of the child at baptism speaks to this concern: "God is the giver of all life, human and divine. May He bless the parents of this child. They will be the first teachers of their child in the ways of faith. May they be also the best of teachers, bearing witness to the faith by what they say and do, in Christ Jesus our Lord."

We can summarize this binary relationship of the Baptism of Jesus to our baptism with this concise statement. At the Baptism of Jesus the water was made holy by the One being baptized; at our baptism we were made holy by the waters that flowed from his side on the cross.

Vaccination is a medical analogy of baptism. They both save lives in ways unseen.

Repair Work at St. Fidelis

You may have noticed scaffolding all around the inside of the Basilica of St. Fidelis. Repair work to fix falling plaster and a repainting of the entire inside has begun. It has been 25 years since the last major repainting and repair work; however, minor repair and painting jobs have occurred during those 25 years.

Tim Linenberger, with Linenberger Painting and Contracting of Salina, Kansas, and his crew are in charge of the project which is expected to take approximately three months. Tim is a member of the family that has painted St. Fidelis several times—in 1943, 1961, 1979, and 1996.

It was necessary to remove the Stations of the Cross temporarily. By the way, the Stations are approximately 3.5 feet by 8 feet. They don't look that big on the walls, do they?

The redecorating is being done using the same colors as are currently on the walls. Tim Linenberger said the painting will probably officially start this Tuesday, once all the scaffolding is in place.

Masses will continue as usual.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

DIOCESE OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).

The 2021 Diocesan Men's Conference is set for **Saturday, August 14**, at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish, Hays. More information to come later.



SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.
