

To Whom Shall We Go?

For the past five weeks we have been reading from the gospel of John on the presence of Christ in the Eucharist and today we come to the climactic close.

Christ told the crowds, "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." The people asked rhetorically, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

And they walked away. Christ then asked his apostles if they would also leave. Peter responded, "To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

There is a temptation to suggest that Christ was speaking symbolically and the Eucharist is only a reminder of the Body and

Blood of Christ. The early Christians did not believe in such symbolism, and the Catholic Church has never taught that the Eucharist is merely symbolic.

The Catholic Catechism says that Christ is "truly, really, and substantially present in the Eucharist, body and blood, soul and divinity." Christ is present bodily, but not physically. A spiritual body, not a physical body. It is the Risen Lord who is present in the Eucharist. It can be misleading to portray Christ in the Eucharist as the infant of Bethlehem or the victim on Mount Calvary. The Christ who is truly and bodily present in Holy Communion is the risen Christ.

The presence of the risen Christ in the Eucharist means that the bread is the body of Christ, not as textured flesh and bone, but as the identity of the person. The consecrated wine is the blood of Christ, not as an anatomical fluid, but as the very life of the person. "This is the cup of my blood," can be properly understood as, "This is the cup of my life." Receiving Communion is a commingling of the life of Christ with our own life.

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."

The Eucharist unites our person with the person of Christ, which satisfies our spiritual hunger. We do not hunger for an image of God, or a symbol of God, or a reminder of God. We

hunger for God. Holy Communion satisfies that hunger because the risen Christ is truly present in the Eucharist.

Christ asked his disciples, "Will you also leave me?" Note carefully St. Peter's reply, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." That was the promise of the Eucharist: "Whoever eats this bread will live forever."
