

John 6:1-15



Saint Mark is on Vacation

You might have noticed something different about this Sunday's gospel. This is year B of the liturgical cycle when we read from Mark, but today's gospel of the multiplication of the loaves, although recounted in Mark, is taken from John. Not a mistake. For the next five Sundays Mark will be on summer vacation and we will read the sixth chapter of the gospel of John, his treatise on the Eucharist.



John does not record the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. His account of that final meal of Christ with his apostles features the lesson of humble service illustrated by the washing of feet. Yet John did not forget the gift of the Eucharist. He devoted an entire chapter of his gospel to the meaning of this sublime sacrament. We will read that important instruction the next five Sundays.

John begins his discourse on the Eucharist with the story of the multiplication of the loaves. This story offers many lessons of Christian living—sharing our blessings, the

providence of God, the responsibility of the surplus leftovers—but the setting in John's gospel highlights the promise of the Eucharists as food for our spiritual journey, multiplied daily throughout the ages.

The numbers in the account of the multiplication of the loaves are not mathematical but symbolic. The five loaves recall the five books of the law, the Old Testament Torah. The two fish are symbolic of the divinity and humanity of Christ, as well as the two Biblical Testaments.

The actions of Christ at the feeding of the five thousand recall those of the Last Supper when the Eucharist was instituted. Note the similarity of the wording. "Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them to those who were reclining." Prophetic of the words and actions at that sacred meal on Holy Thursday.

The fragments left over offer a message not only of the abundant providence of God's in providing for our daily needs, but also of the surplus graces that we receive in Holy Communion during Mass. We receive more than sufficient grace for that moment in church, a surplus that remains with us that we can later gather up to strengthen us in our daily lives.

The Second Vatican Council said that the Eucharist is "the source and the summit of our Christian life." The next four Sundays will continue with the sixth chapter of John's gospel, a clear and challenging explanation of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Stay tuned, and alert.

Today We Celebrate the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly


Earlier this year, Pope Francis established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. It will take place each year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne (July 26). This year the special day will be celebrated **TODAY—Sunday, July 25.**

From the Vatican News website:

Recalling the feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple—when the elderly Simeon and Anna encountered the child Jesus and recognized Him as the Messiah—Pope Francis said, “the Holy Spirit even today stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly.” The voice of the elderly “is precious,” he said, “because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples.” The elderly, he continued, “remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generations, to pass on to the young the experience of life.”

The Holy Father said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because “grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on” what the elderly have received.

He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another.
