Labor Every Day

Monday is Labor Day. On Labor Day, paradoxically, we do not labor. But we engage in the most difficult aspect of labor-we search for its modern culture meaning. Our concentrates on the financial and social dimensions of work, seldom reflecting on the spiritual meaning of our labors.

When Peter needed money for taxes, Jesus told him to go catch a fish, to labor at his profession. After the Resurrection when Jesus was preparing breakfast for the Apostles, he asked them to bring the fish they had caught. In his parable about workers in the vineyard, the master was disturbed by unemployment and said to those in the marketplace, "Why are you standing here idle? Go into the vineyard and work."

Scripture teaches that God does not work in the world apart from us. We are his stewards. He raises children through mothers and fathers. He heals through doctors and nurses. He imparts knowledge through teachers tutors. He builds through carpenters and craftsmen. Whatever your profession, you are laboring in the vineyard of the Lord.

Christ also taught that work is not the be-all and end-all of life. He knew the importance of recreation and renewal. He invited his apostles to a quiet place to rest awhile. Christianity understands the paradox that on Labor Day we do not labor.

Jesus understood prayer was an integral part of the work of his Father. The word "liturgy" means "the work of the people." Christ went faithfully to the synagogue and temple for liturgical prayer. We do not make our living by this work of prayer, but it is the work that gives meaning to our living. Whatever your work, it is only a parttime job. Your full-time job is becoming the person of
